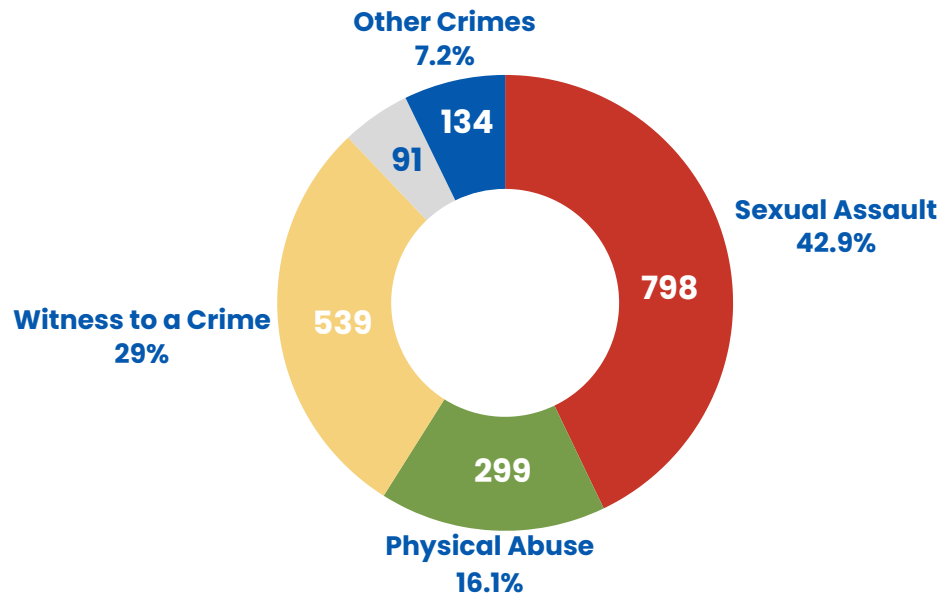

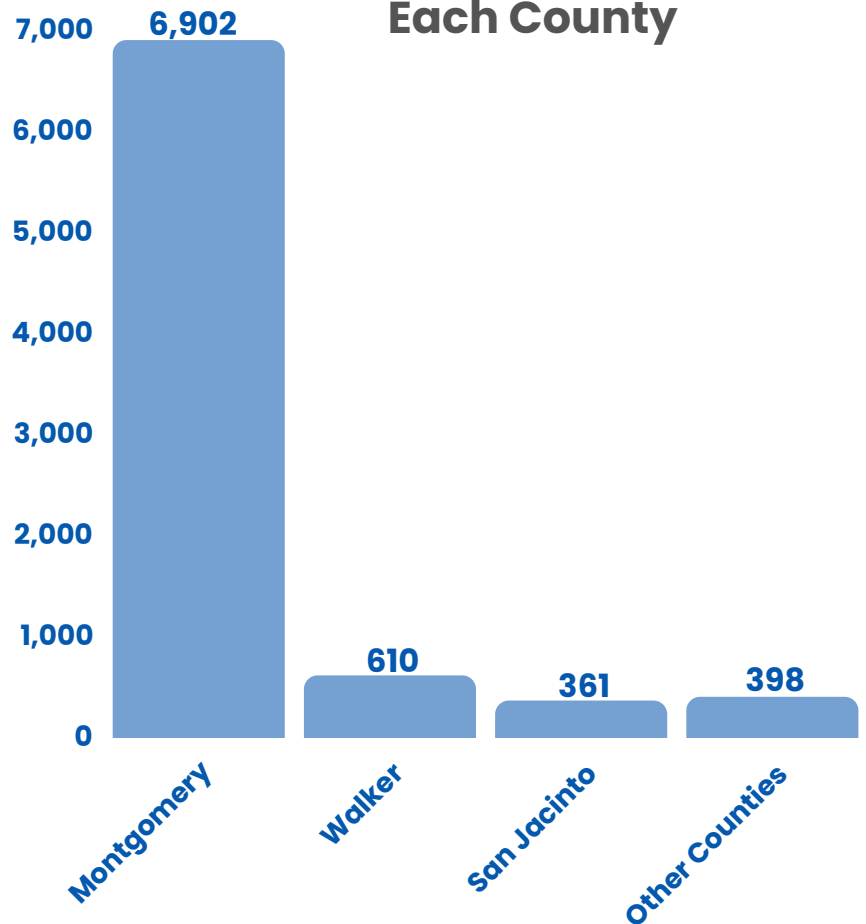
Percent of Female & Male Clients



Client Victimizations



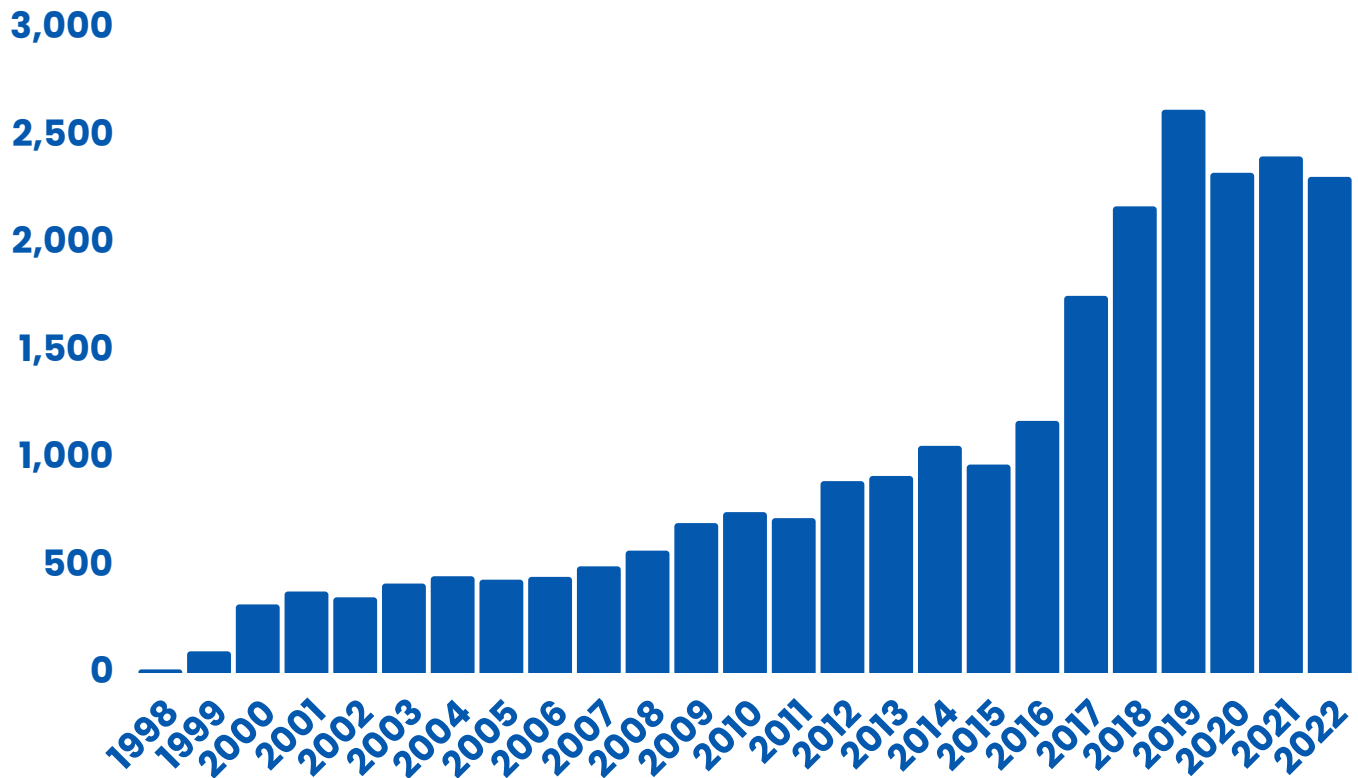
Child Abuse Reports from Each County



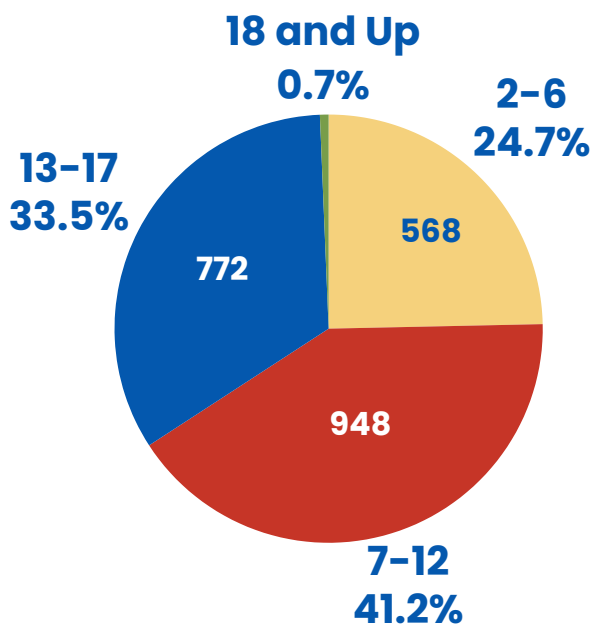

Here is just one child's life that has been impacted by your continued support...

In 2022, a 16 year old boy was **sexually assaulted by his teacher**. Law enforcement responded to the case and scheduled a forensic interview for the boy at Children's Safe Harbor. The boy and his parents were able to come to Children's Safe Harbor as a **central location to receive all needed services** and meet with the investigative agencies. He spoke with a forensic interviewer regarding the details of his abuse which allowed investigating agencies to determine charges and next steps. During the forensic interview his parents were able to meet with a Family Advocate and received needed crisis support and community assistance. The family had experienced extensive trauma and financial stress in addition to his sexual assault. The boy and his parents were referred to Children's Safe Harbor's counseling department and received **wrap-around free trauma therapy in the form of individual sessions and group work as a family**. When he started counseling he presented an array of post trauma symptoms such as: avoidance; substance abuse; anger; and, safety concerns around multiple suicide attempts. This case went to criminal trial and the perpetrator was sentenced to prison. To this day, this young man remains in our counseling services and has made monumental strides such as getting a full time job, and the mitigation of trauma symptoms. **This success story speaks to the power of our work in intervening and moving past the effects of childhood trauma and healing the family as a whole.**
